

KIP TAYLOR MEMORIAL PROGRAM

KIP TAYLOR CLASS OF '81

Many of you have asked what we ~ the Berlin Brats ~ can do in memory of Kip?

For our new members, who may not have received our previous newsletter, Kip Taylor, Class of \$11, was killed in the attack on the Pentiagon on September 11th "where he was serving his country as a promotable Major in the U.S. Army. Since then he has been posithumously promoted to Lieutenant Colonel. Kip is survived by his wife, Nancy and the sons. (Daen Poss is 28 months and John Luke is 8 months).

As of this month, a Kip Taylor Memorial Fund has been established at AOSHS by the Berlin Brats. This fund will finance the purchase of a grante pawer, measuring 16" X 16" to be located on the grounds of the American Overseas School Historical Park in Wichtla, Kansas.

The cost of the paver is \$1,000. The Berlin Brats have opened the "memorial fund" with the initial contribution of \$100. It is hoped that the balance will be raised through contributions from fellow alumni.
