DISCRIMINATING FACTS!

The newspaper staff has recently received a disturbing letter to the newspaper indicating discrimination at BAHS. Whether or not this is true is not up to an individual to decide but rather the school as a whole.

There are many types of discrimination in today's society and these acts of prejudice toward other people are not something that should be accepted, but are, unfortunately, ever present.

People can be discriminated against for their sex, ethnical heritage, social & economical status, handicaps, religion, profession, hair, clothes & anything that another person may see as less worthy.

Alone, some of these prejudices may not seem important, but they rarely come completely alone and may be quite undermining for persons victimized by other people's bigotry.

One form of discrimination that is still present in society is racial prejudice or more correctly: Discrimination on grounds of ethnic or racial heritage.

In a recent speech made on the slain civil-right's leader, Martin Luther King Jr's birthday, President Ronald Reagan stated that America should denounce prejudices and bigotry and live without certain unstated incidents that prevoke conflicts between groups of different ethnic heritage.

An example of the racial discrimination problem is prejudice towards people of Turkish descent within Berlin-West. This is a growing problem and has in hundreds of cases lead to violence between Turkish and German groups.

It is the hope of this Co-Editor that racial discrimination is not present at Berlin American High School, and there is no reason to believe it is a problem at the pride of DoDDS.

But, as I have stated, it is up to you to speak out to solve the problems of this school.

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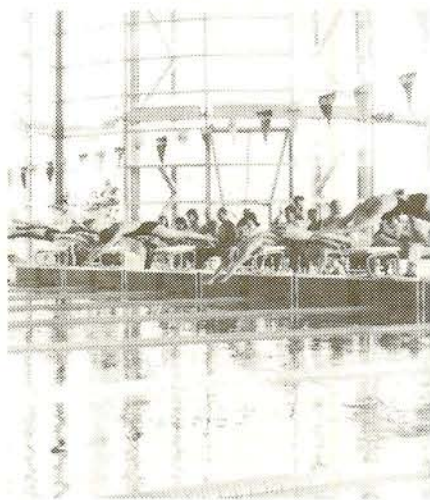
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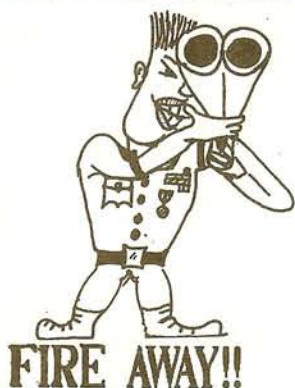
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The Berlin Bear-A-Cudas swam Championships in Munich last Sun. the 15 of March.
