Homecoming 1978



Green Week





JV Squad














With only four returnees, Coach Howe pulled together a relatively inexperienced team in time for their first mutch.



The varsity team ended the season with a record of one win and eight losses, and the JV team had a record of three wins and three losses.








Berlin J.V. Football







Cross-Country 1978




