# Homecoming 1978

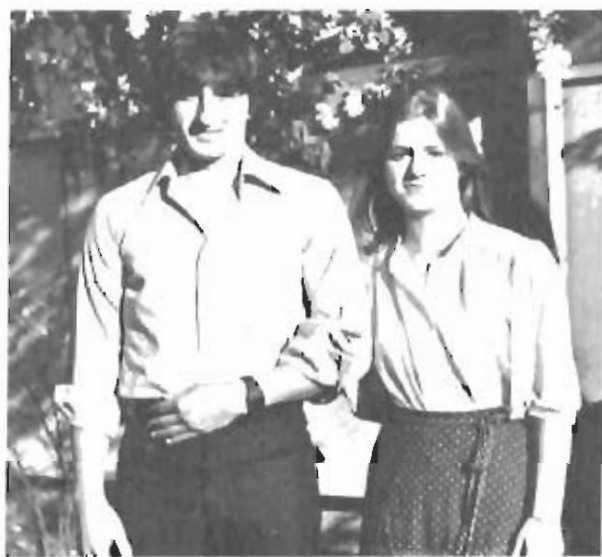

# Green Week

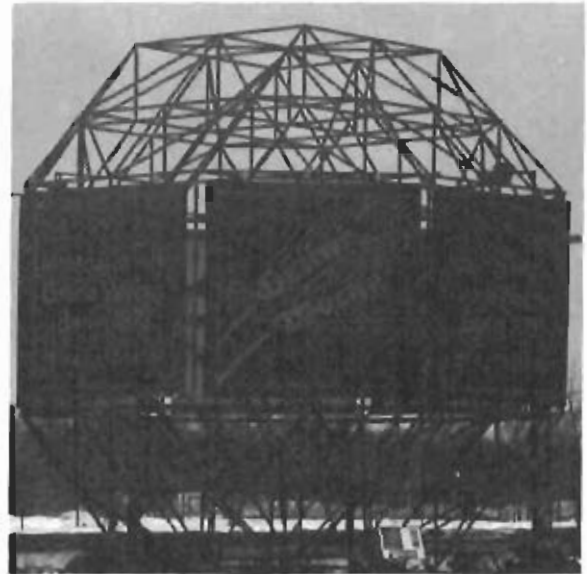

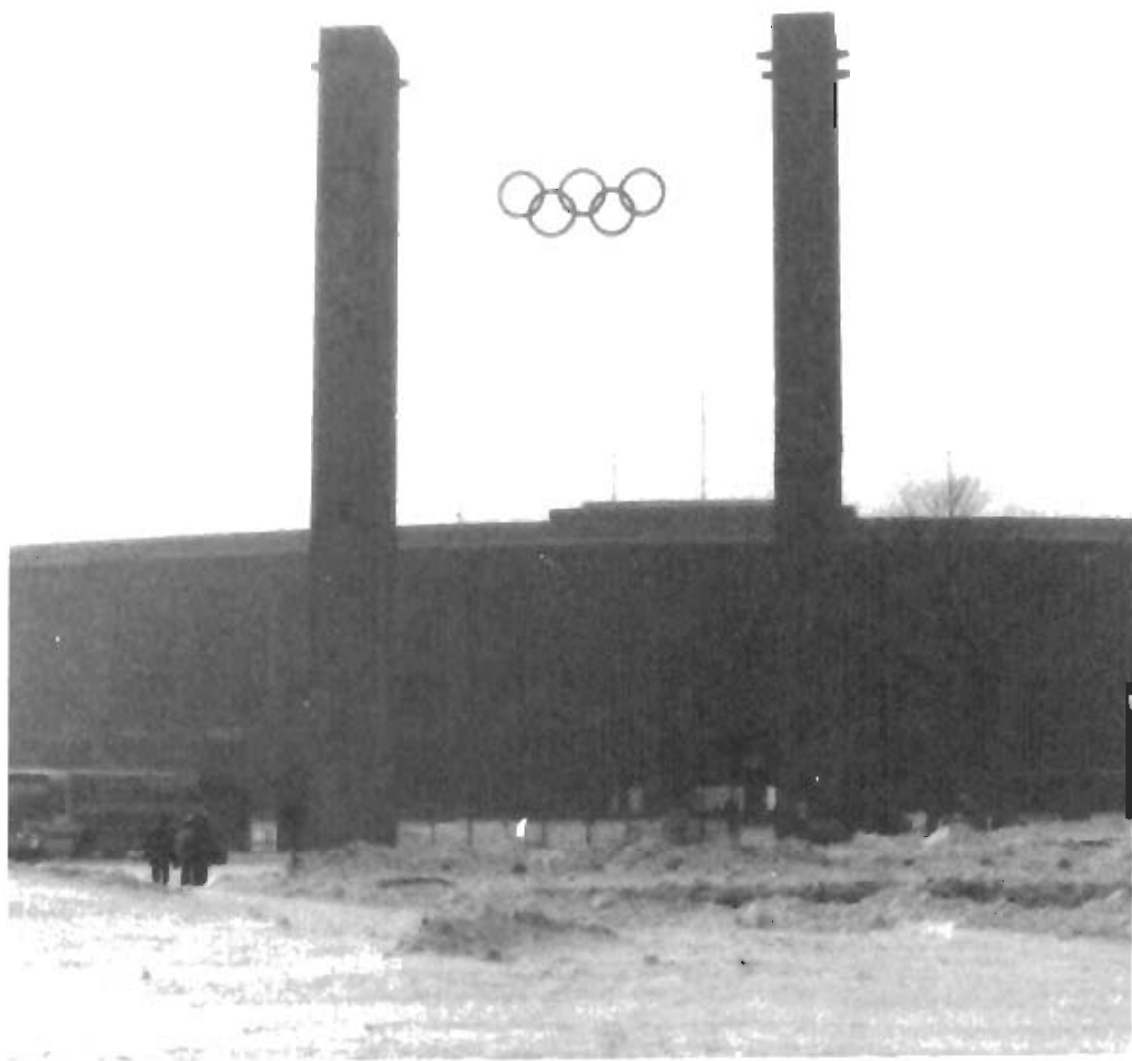

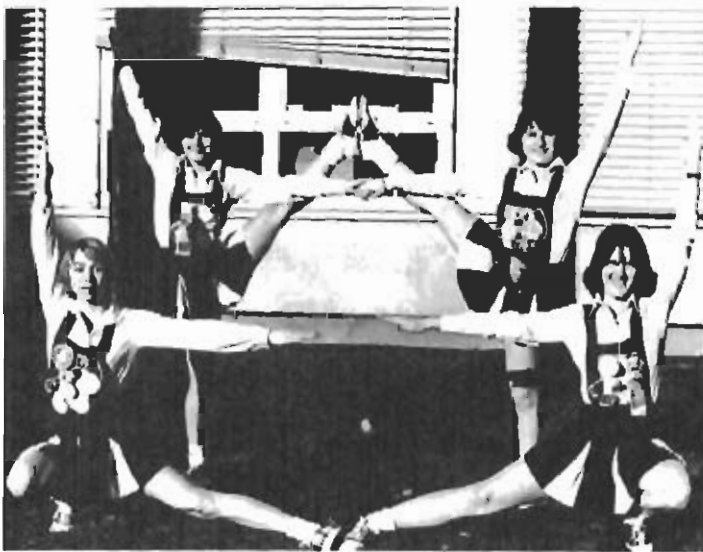

# JV Squad



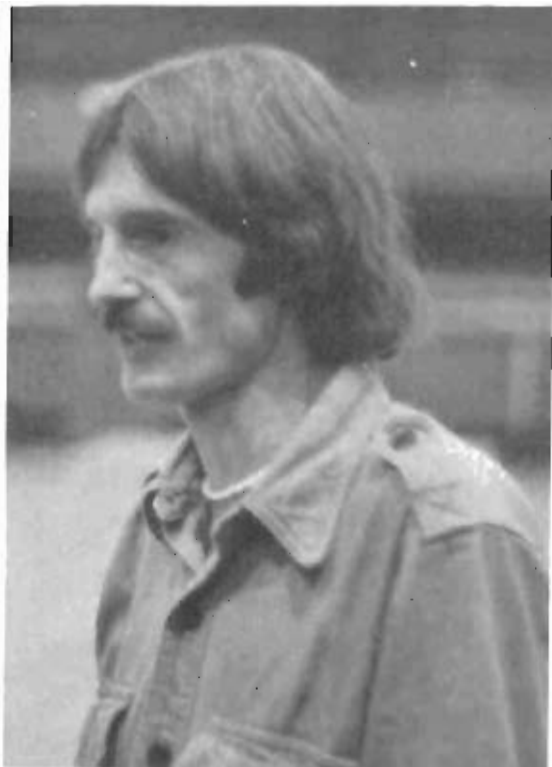

With only four returnees, Coach Howe pulled together a relatively inexperienced team in time for their first match.

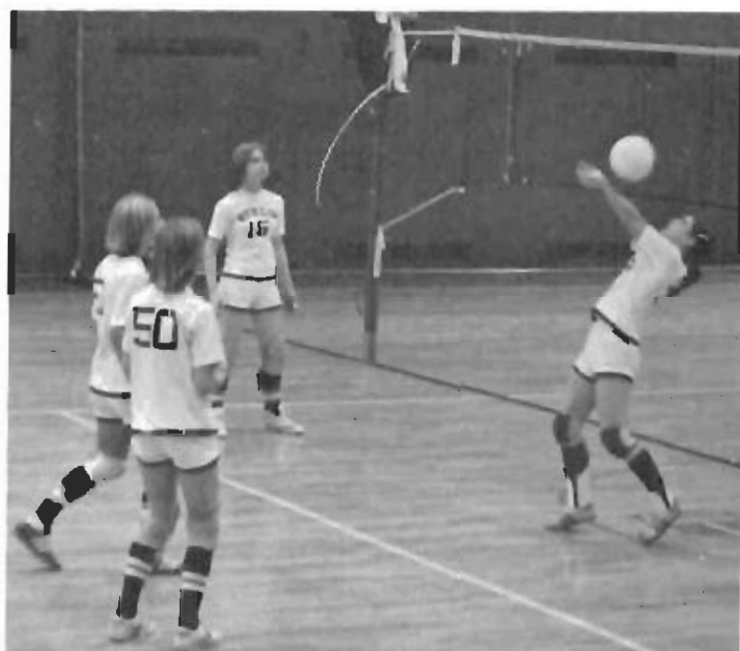
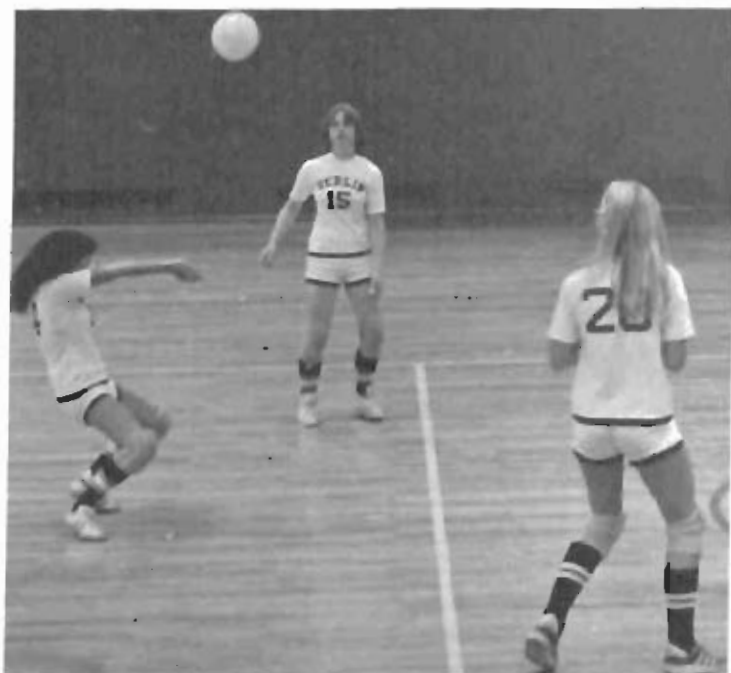

## Cross-Country 1978





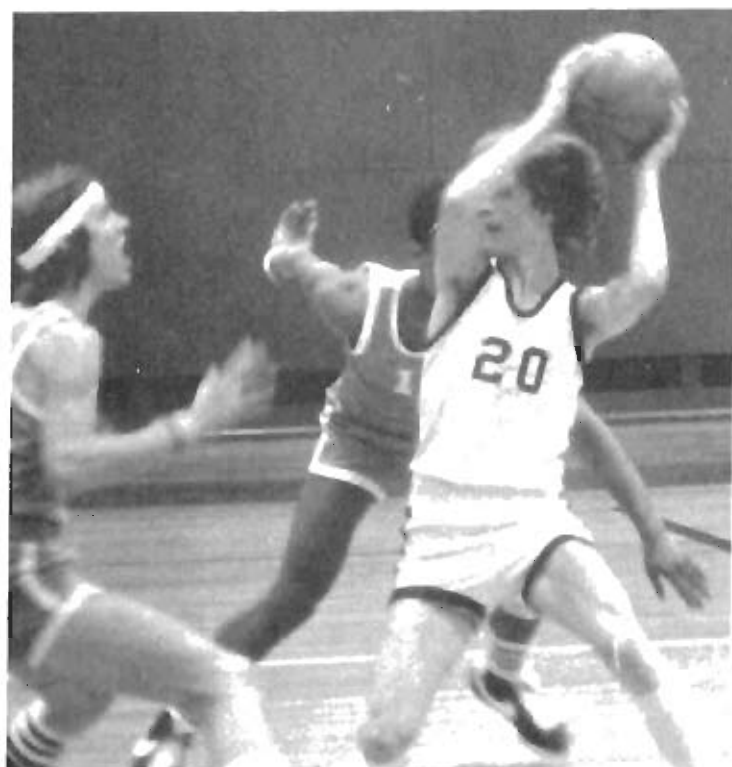

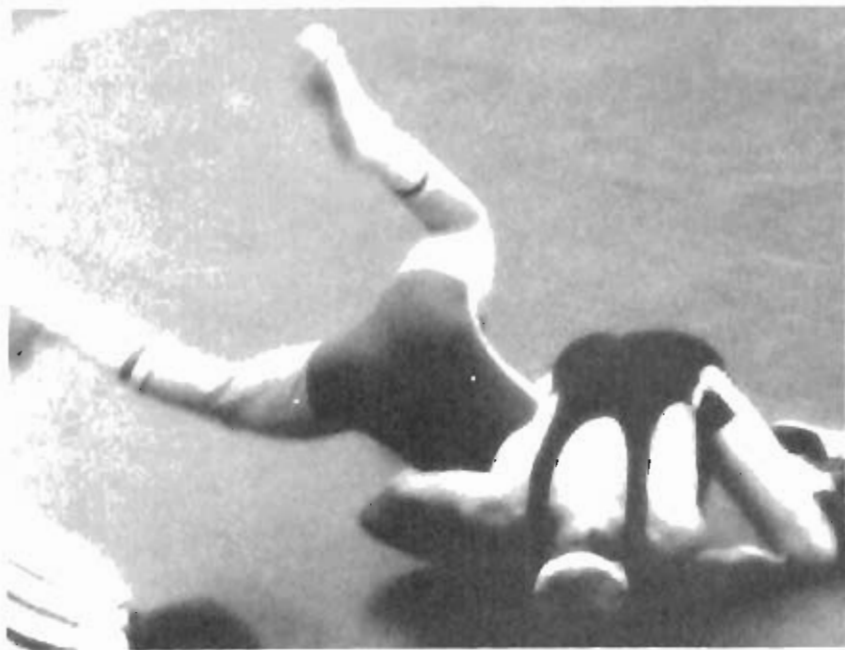
