

# ***Bear-A-Cudas' Walsh sets European record***

The undefeated Berlin Bear-A-Cudas returned from their swim meet Sunday with 102 out of 128 titles after effectively defeating Hahn, West Germany 317-91.

Todd Walsh spurred the Berlin team forward as he stroked to victory, breaking the European Forces Swim League record for 13-14 year-old boys in the 100-meter breaststroke. His time was 1:22.98.

Bear-A-Cudas swimmers provided three triple winners. Chris Phipps led the 11 to 12-year-old boys in the 100-meter individual medley, 50-meter breaststroke and 50-meter butterfly. Didi Stowell stroked to victory in the 100-meter freestyle, 100-meter butterfly and 200-meter individual medley for girls ages 15-19. In the 15-19 boys, Lars Amis took the 200-meter individual medley, 100-meter backstroke and 100-meter butterfly.

Many valuable points were accumulated with double victories. Peter

Stowell grabbed first in the freestyle and individual medley for boys 10-and-under. The 11-12 girls shared titles with Beth Ballard's freestyle and breaststroke, and Karen Cox's individual medley and backstroke. Jeff Edelman's freestyle and backstroke took first in boys' 11-12 age group, as Walsh lead 13-14 boys with his record breaking breaststroke, along with his individual medley title.

The 15-19 age group winners were Kelly Murphy in the backstroke and breaststroke, and Jerry Rettie in the freestyle and breaststroke.

Berlin swimmers divided singles titles with many capturing additional swim points. They were Knut Amis, Bobby Cox, Christine Cox, Eric Dimmery, Kristy Dimmery, Karen Edelmann, Dennis Patton, and Peter Rigney.

Berlin's undefeated Bear-A-Cudas will host Munich Sunday at Andrews pool.

# *Walsh breaks breaststroke record in Bear-A-Cudas swim victory*

Berlin's Bear-A-Cudas traveled to Heidelberg and swam their way to victory over Heidelberg and Mannheim in their first tri-meet swim competition of the year.

Out of 48 events, 24 swimmers from the walled city took titles. Todd Walsh competing in the 11-12 age group, broke the European Forces Swim League record in the 50-meter breaststroke. His time of 37.66 bettered the previous time of 38.62 by just under one second. Walsh also placed first in the 50-meter freestyle and 100-meter individual medley.

Lars Asmis took titles in the 100-meter butterfly and 100-meter breaststroke in the boys' 15-18 age group while Peter Stowell, competing in the 10-and-under category, won the 50-meter freestyle and backstroke events.

In the girl's competition, Kirstin Walsh stroked to victory in the 50-meter breaststroke and 50-meter freestyle events in the 10-and-under age group. Suzanne Rivard earned firsts in the 50-meter freestyle and 50-meter backstroke for girl's ages 11-12.

Other multiple place finishers were Bethany Ballard, Nona Ballard, Christine Cox, Karen Cox, Eric Dimmery, Chris Fortune, Eero Keravuori, Chris Phipps, Peter Rigney, Robert Rigney, Sally Shoup, and Cathy Speer.

The Bear-A-Cudas will travel to Augsburg Oct. 25, and their first swim competition at home will be Nov. 1 against Hahn.

A repeating triple-winner, Lars Asmis, decisively stroked to victory taking the 100-meter free-style, 100-meter butterfly and 200-meter individual medley in the boys' 15-19 age group.

# 'Cudas end Seals winning streak

The Berlin Bear-A-Cudas swam to an exciting victory over the previously unbeaten SHAPE Seals at Andrews Pool Sunday, by a score of 215-201.

The Bear-A-Cudas had two triple winners in their victory. Karen Edelman won the 10-and-under girl's 100-meter individual medley, 50-meter breaststroke, and 50-meter butterfly while Phipps won the 11-12-year-old boys' 100-meter individual medley, 50-meter breaststroke and 50-meter butterfly.

The four double winners from the Bear-A-Cudas were Peter Rigney in the 10-and-under freestyle and butterfly,

Todd Walsh in the 13-14-year-old freestyle and breaststroke events, Kurt Aasmis in the 13-14-year-old individual medley and butterfly events and Alan Svensen in the 15-19-year-old freestyle and butterfly.

Impressive single victories were turned in by Peter Stowell, individual medley; Chris Minderman, freestyle; Aryn Ballard and Bill Karavouri, backstroke; and Bethany Ballard and Shannon Heath in the breaststroke events.

The victory left the 'Cudas with a 9-2 league record and 10-2 overall record. The SHAPE Seals finished the season with a 10-1 record to become the 1982-83 European Forces Swim League Champions.

Although the regular season is over, the Bear-A-Cudas swimmers continue to work toward two new challenges.

On Saturday, the swimmers compete in a two-hour Swim-The-Wall at Andrews from 11 a.m. to 1 p.m. Climaxing the season will be the European Forces Swim League Championships on April 17 at Munich's Olympic Complex.

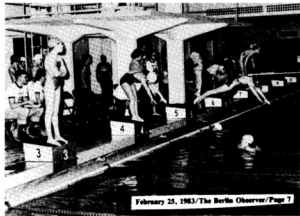

## 'Cudas bring back gold from invitational

Munich's beautiful Olympia Park was the site of the 1983 European Forces Swim League Invitational Championships on April 11. Because of their season — long dedication, hard work, and superb performance — 33 of the 'Cudas qualified to compete along with top swimmers of twelve other teams.

The traditional Olympic-style gold, silver and bronze medals were presented to the top three finishers of each race during the competition. Berlin swimmers captured 13 gold, 9 silver, and 4 bronze medals — more than any other competing team.

Six Bear-A-Cudas finished first in their individual races winning the coveted gold medal. Karen Edelman was

Berlin's triple winner in the 10-and under girls 100-meter individual medley, 50-meter breaststroke, and 50-meter butterfly.

A new league record was established in the 13-14 boys 100-meter breaststroke by Todd Walsh with a time of 1:18.88. Todd also won a gold for his performance in the 200-meter individual medley and a fourth place finish in the 100-meter freestyle. Other dual gold medal winners include Aryn Ballard winning the 10-and under girls 50-meter freestyle and 50-meter backstroke and Peter Rigney winning the 10-and under boys 50-meter freestyle and 50-meter butterfly. Ballard also finished second in the 50-meter butterfly and Rigney finished second in the 100-meter individual medley.

Single first place finishes include Bethany Ballard's 11-12 girls 50-meter breaststroke and Chris Phipp's 11-12 boys 50-meter butterfly. Ballard placed second in 100-meter individual medley

with Phipps finishing second in 100-meter individual medley, and third in the 50-meter breaststroke.

Silver medals were won by Didi Stowell in the 15-19 girls 100-meter freestyle, Knut Asmis 13-14 boys 100-meter butterfly, and Lars Asmis 15-19 100-meter butterfly. Stowell placed fourth in the 100-meter backstroke with K. Asmis placing fifth in 100-meter breaststroke and L. Asmis placing fourth in the 200-meter individual medley.

Alan Svenson won a bronze for the 15-19 boys 200-meter individual medley and

finished fourth in the 100-meter freestyle and 100-meter butterfly. Other medal winners included Alison Klukas, Marla Minderman, Jay Tydlaska, Jeffrey Edelman, and Nona Ballard.

The 10-and under relay team of Aryn Ballard, Karen Edelman, Jay Tydlaska, and Peter Rigney won gold medals for their first place finishes in the 200-meter medley relay and 200-meter freestyle relay.
