


3) The newsletter will include updated addresses, so you guys can keep in touch with each other. (If you want to receive the newsletter, but don't want your address published, please stipulate.)



## Berlin Brats Association





Berlin Brats Association was formed on October 1, 1991, in response to interest expressed by former alumni of Berlin American High School to maintain contact with one another. The Association's purposes include:

\*To locate and open dialogue with alumni and former teachers.

\*To communicate on a regular basis with alumni and former teachers.

\*To network alumni and former teachers with one another.

\*To inform alumni of pertinent facts concerning the school, their friends, their teachers, and events in Berlin.

\*To inform alumni of planned reunions.

\*To encourage alumni to plan reunions.

\*To network with other overseas groups for the purpose of shared ideas and experiences.

In order to fulfill these purposes the following goals have been established:

- 1) A newsletter will be mailed twice a year: once in September and once in February.
- 2) A fund will be established to pay for the expenses of printing, mailing, and verifying addresses to mail the newsletter. The moneys collected will be credited for a fiscal year beginning each August.
- 3) An All-Class reunion has been scheduled for 1996 in the Dallas-Ft. Worth area.
- 4) A portion of the funds collected for the newsletter will be set aside as an installment on the deposit required for the reunion. The moneys collected from individuals will be assigned to their deposit. At present (10/91) the amount collected from each individual equals \$10, five of which is set aside for that individual's deposit for the planned reunion.
- 5) An account has been established in Grapevine, TX, at the Carswell AFB Credit Union under the name of Laura Thornton/Berlin Brats. Laura (Coats) Thornton will be in charge of depositing funds, and crediting individual's accordingly for the funds sent. Lillian (Motley) Matthews of Garland, TX, has been designated the beneficiary and authorized to sign for moneys.
- 6) A roster will be published yearly in November to update the addresses and encourage contact among the alumni during the holiday season. This roster will include a memorium page to those alumni who have left this world for a better.
- 7) An accounting of the funds will be published in February's newsletter in order to acquaint the alumni of the financial status of the Association.
- 8) In order to better provide the services the alumni desire, the alumni will be surveyed from time to time.
- 9) Laura Thornton has joined Overseas Brats and will maintain contact with that organization for the purpose of networking.

After completion of the All Class Reunion in 1996, all the funds will be transferred and responsibilities will be delegated to those individuals who will plan the next reunion, tentatively set the be held in California.
