Communist Propaganda: The Berliner Zeitung, a newspaper published in the Soviet Sector of Berlin published on Jan. 27 the map (on the opposite page) alleging to show that western Berlin is a horrible place. Even at the time this map was published, hundreds of residents of the surrounding Sovietdominated territories were pouring daily into the same area to seek refuge and asylum from oppression. Below are direct translations of the labels applied in the Berliner Zeitung to certain designated spots. Most of the labels are distortions and false, for instance, "No. 19, Olympic Stadium, off limits to Germans," was returned to German control four years ago and has been the scene of many German sporting events.


